The global impact of the Russian invasion of Ukraine, and its possible outcomes, were explored by faculty and students at a forum last week in Hammond Hall.

Professor Joshua Spero (Economics, History and Political Science) organized the forum, which included input from student Oscar Burgos Pimentel, with whom Spero traveled to Poland in March and encountered Ukrainian refugees in person.



Professor Teresa Fava Thomas and Professor Eric Budd helped frame the discussion in historical terms.


Did you know that Fitchburg State faculty, librarians, staff and students can use their Fitchburg State OneCard to receive discounts on purchases at local businesses?
