Winter Commencement ceremony Friday

The university will hold the winter ceremony of its 127th commencement exercises at 6:30 p.m. Friday in the campus Athletics and Recreation Center.

In addition to the address by President Lapidus, the ceremony will include remarks by

undergraduate valedictorian **Dylan J. Dandy** of Leominster (double-majoring in mathematics and chemistry) and Graduate Student Leadership Award recipient **Maryanne Fiorino** of Danvers (completing an MBA with a concentration in healthcare management).



The university recently received a \$40,000 grant from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to support its dual enrollment program, expanding opportunities for local high school students to take credit-bearing, collegelevel courses.

Gov. Maura Healey and Lt. Gov. Kim Driscoll announced the grant award this week in a letter to President Lapidus.

"We want to thank you for your commitment to increasing college participation through dual enrollment activities, particularly for low-income, underrepresented, and first-generation college students," the award letter stated. "Through this funding and your continued support, we hope to expand access to great educational opportunities for every student in the Commonwealth."
