In 2023, FSU added another concentration– Community Justice concentration, M.S. Criminal Justice to the catalog. These programs developed organically to meet students' needs that could not be anticipated until the

New Mission of Master of Science in Criminal Justice:

This program provides students with practical knowledge and skills based on current research in the field while also providing an understanding of ethical issues and dilemmas related to the profession. The program focuses on building student's problem solving skills and their ability to analyze and understand data to assist with decision making, especially in a culturally diverse community.

Program outcomes

- 1) Students will use their knowledge about the criminal justice system applying theoretical frameworks to solve problems in an ethical manner.
- 2) Students will critically analyze and address real life scenarios using social science research and data to ascertain the community impact.
- 3) Students develop oral and written skills to communicate effectively with a culturally diverse public about justice and policy issues.

Concentration Option 1--MPTC (36 credits; available only to Fitchburg State undergraduate students in the 4+1 Police Program)

Mission:

The role of the police officer is intellectually demanding, requiring officers to possess knowledge and skills in both substantive and procedural law, police procedures, problem solving, crisis management, written and oral communication, technology, and professionalism.

Additional program goal:

Students will demonstrate how policing as an institution works in a culturally diverse democratic society.

Concentration Option 2--Community Justice (30 credits)

Mission: As social justice philosophies and practices become more embedded in the fabric of society and even into the fabric of the overall criminal justice system, this concentration provides graduate students with a broader, more holistic, socially-just, systems approach to crime causation, deterrence, and cessation. This concentration offers students ways to engage the community to prevent crime and reduce the harmful consequences of criminal justice-related activities.

Additional program goal:

Students will critically examine the traditional justice system to find alternative community justice approaches. Students will analyze communities to identify stakeholders and partners to improve justice at the community level.

We propose to have this change implements in Fall 2025. We are simply moving all of the different concentrations under one Master in Criminal Justice. The requirements do not change.
