

- Strong analytical, organizational, and decision-making skills with a commitment to fiscal integrity, accessibility, and transparency

- 10+ years of executive-level experience in higher education finance, preferably at a public university or state system
- Proficiency with enterprise resource planning (ERP) systems, such as Ellucian Banner, Workday, or Oracle, and familiarity with data visualization tools (e.g., Tableau, Power BI)
- Demonstrated success in enhancing revenue streams, including grant management, auxiliary revenue, and private fundraising collaboration
- Experience with long-range financial planning, including debt strategy, endowment growth, and capital campaign planning
- A deep understanding of the role finance plays in advancing institutional access, student success, and inclusive excellence, with experience supporting mission-driven initiatives that serve a broad and diverse campus community



ABOUT FITCHBURG STATE UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1894 as the State Normal School in Fitchburg, Fitchburg State University has proudly evolved from its origins as a two-year teachertraining institution for women into a comprehensive public university serving a diverse population of learners. The school's first home was a temporary facility in an old high school building on Academy Street, staffed by Principal John G. Thompson and three faculty members. Even in its inaugural year, with 46 pioneering students, the institution quickly proved its value—and outgrew its modest beginnings.

In 1896, the campus moved to its permanent home atop a rural hill with the construction of what is now Thompson Hall, still in use today. This early milestone marked the beginning of more than a century of growth, innovation, and dedication to public higher education.

True to its mission of adapting to the evolving needs of students and society, Fitchburg State was an early leader in experiential education. Edgerly Hall, opened in 1901, was created as a model school where aspiring educators could gain real-world experience. It became one of the nation's first junior high schools in 1910 and introduced the first practical arts teacher-training program for men in 1911, cementing Fitchburg's reputation for educational innovation.

Throughout the 20th century, the institution expanded both academically and physically. Student life flourished in the 1920s, with the formation of literary societies, debate councils, performing arts groups, and a growing athletics program. As enrollment and interests broadened, the campus acquired additional land to accommodate new academic programs and facilities.

Significant academic milestones followed. In 1930, the school was authorized to award bachelor's degrees in practical arts, and by 1932—when it became the State Teachers College at Fitchburg—it began offering four-year degrees across all areas of education. Graduate-level programming was introduced by 1935 and evening courses began in 1954, further enhancing access for non-traditional and working students.

In 1960, the institution expanded its academic mission beyond teacher preparation, evolving into the State College at Fitchburg, and later, in 1965, Fitchburg State College. Over the following decades, it matured into a dynamic institution offering a wide array of undergraduate and graduate programs. By the early 21st century, it provided 49 undergraduate majors, 20 master's programs, five advanced graduate study certificates, and several graduate certificates, all designed to meet the needs of a changing workforce and society.

In 2010, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts established a formal state university system, and the institution adopted its current name: Fitchburg State University. Today, the university enrolls approximately 6,000 students across undergraduate, graduate, online, and professional studies programs. The 60-acre campus includes 42 buildings and serves as a cultural, intellectual, and economic anchor for the Montachusett region and beyond.

Now in its second century, Fitchburg State continues to evolve while remaining true to its founding values: providing accessible, high-quality public higher education; empowering first-generation and underrepresented students; and fueling regional opportunity through innovation, equity, and academic excellence. With its commitment to strategic transformation and its pursuit of emerging Hispanic-Serving Institution status, Fitchburg State is shaping the future while honoring its historic mission.

LIFE IN FITCHBURG AND NORTH CENTRAL MASSACHUSETTS

Nestled in the heart of New England, Fitchburg and the broader North Central Massachusetts region offer an exceptional quality of life that blends natural beauty, cultural vibrancy, and economic opportunity. Recognized by Explore.com as one of New England's most underrated college towns, Fitchburg is an ideal setting for professionals, families, and students alike.

The city boasts a dynamic and growing arts scene, anchored by the renowned Fitchburg Art Museum and supported by a network of local galleries, theaters, and public art initiatives. The downtown area is undergoing revitalization, with exciting developments like the Theater Block project and Fitchburg State's own ideaLab, which are helping to transform the city into a hub for creative enterprise, innovation, and community engagement.

Nature lovers and outdoor enthusiasts are drawn to the region's wealth of recreational options. From the slopes of Wachusett Mountain and the trails of Leominster State Forest to the scenic Nashua River Rail Trail and numerous state parks, the area offers year-round opportunities for hiking, biking, skiing, and exploring the natural landscape.

North Central Massachusetts is also known for its affordability—offering a range of housing options at price points well below those in Greater Boston. The region features diverse culinary experiences, a mix of locally owned shops and national retailers, and a strong network of public schools and community services.

Strategically located just one hour from Boston and 30 minutes from Worcester, Fitchburg offers the perfect balance of small-city charm and bigcity access. With a growing regional economy, strong civic leadership, and a commitment to cultural and educational advancement, North Central Massachusetts is not just a great place to work—it's a great place to call home.



SELECTED CHRONOLOGY

- The university was established in 1894 by an act of the Massachusetts Legislature. Opened as the State Normal School in Fitchburg, it first operated in temporary quarters in the city's former high school building. The modern campus took shape with the building of Thompson Hall in 1896.
- Edgerly Hall, originally home of the School of Observation and Practice, opened in 1901, and in 1910 became one of the first junior high schools in the country.
- In 1932, the Normal School was renamed the State Teachers College at Fitchburg.
- Graduate programs were established in 1935.
 The nursing program began in 1943 through a cooperative effort with Burbank Hospital.
- The campus footprint expanded beyond the main quadrangle in 1956, with construction of a residence hall (Herlihy) on North Street.
- The State Teachers College at Fitchburg was renamed the State College at Fitchburg in 1960.
 The science building, named for former President George Condike, opened in 1963.
- In 1965, the institutional name changed to Fitchburg State College.
- A special education program was established in 1971, the same year the McKay Campus School opened. McKay houses a pre-school to eighth grade public school as well as university classrooms. Fitchburg State is the only university in the public system with a working school on campus.

- The university celebrated its centennial in 1994 with a variety of special events and completion of a capital campaign.
- Institution is renamed Fitchburg State
 University in 2010, reflecting the
 comprehensive scope of undergraduate and
 graduate programs. The Undergraduate
 Conference for Research and Creative Practice
 is held for the first time.
- The renovated Hammond Hall reopens in 2012, creating a "front door" bridging the campus and wider community.
- The Robert V. and Jeanne S. Antonucci Science Complex was dedicated in 2013, named for the President Emeritus (2003 to 2015) and his wife.
- A groundbreaking police program is launched in 2015, whose graduates complete two degrees in five years along with certification to work in municipal police departments across Massachusetts and neighboring states.
- The university's ties to Main Street are furthered with the purchase in 2016 of a longvacant theater building, renovated into a game design studio and ideaLAB. Renovation of the block itself is in the design stage.
- The Carmelita Landry Arena at Wallace Civic Center is re-dedicated in 2018 as a year-round sports conditioning facility for varsity athletes and students in Exercise and Sports Science program. First class of police program graduates.
- New majors in environmental public health and educational studies launch in 2019, the same year Fitchburg State celebrates 125 years of changing lives.
