*I*t's not an accomplishment that generates headlines. In fact, as with many of an organization's most meaningful, hard-won triumphs, outsiders will likely never even hear of it.

So it is with a school, college or university's once-a-decade accreditation. Over the course of a year or so, institutions devote countless hours to assessing every aspect of the educational experience. Next, a visiting team of academics appointed by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) conducts a rigorous three-day evaluation, resulting in a comprehensive report to NEASC's Commission on Institutions of Higher Education. After meeting with the president and others, the commission releases a final determination.

In last year's annual report I mentioned that we had completed a draft of our self-study. Now, I am delighted to report that NEASC has officially renewed Fitchburg State's accreditation through 2022, describing the university as a forward-looking institution committed to excellence and investing in its facilities and community.

Everyone associated with Fitchburg State should take great pride in this accomplishment. As I have noted in the past, the NEASC review was a thorough and demanding process, and I again offer my deepest gratitude to all who participated in it. I also appreciate NEASC's recognition of all that we do well, even as we look to create an ever-stronger institution. The report will guide us as we continue to refine and integrate our mission and vision statements, strategic and academic plans, and core values. This is a commitment that will be ongoing.



On another academic note, our proposal for a new major in game design was approved by the Massachusetts Board of Higher Education, making us the first public institution in New England to offer a bachelor of science in this field. The major will be part of our heralded Communications Media Department. Members of that faculty designed the curriculum with input from colleagues in the university's computer science, English studies and art programs.

The video game industry is well established in Massachusetts and beyond, with dozens of game studios operating in the commonwealth alone. Even in the midst of economic difficulties, the industry continues to grow and search for talented and well-prepared applicants. With this new major, we continue to move forward with a spirit of innovation and an emphasis on preparing students for rewarding careers.

Students will explore such topics as game design and development, art and visual design, computer programming, 3-D modeling and animation, creative writing, mobile platforms, history of games, and aesthetics.



A key component of our mission is service, and we continue to pursue community involvement on numerous fronts. The university has embarked on a two-year partnership with the Cleghorn Neighborhood Center, putting our resources—in skills, enthusiasm and community spirit—into action to help an organization devoted to one of the city of Fitchburg’s most diverse neighborhoods.

This effort, dubbed the University Project, is run through our Crocker Center for Civic Engagement. The project calls for ongoing efforts to dedicate resources to strengthen not-for-profit organizations in the Fitchburg-Leominster area on a rolling basis.

Several student organizations and campus offices are now involved with the center, volunteering as tutors and mentors, and assisting in seasonal events at the center’s headquarters. The effort is designed to span all sectors of the Fitchburg State community, with opportunities for students, faculty and staff to contribute in areas such as after-school and youth programming, adult education classes and marketing efforts for the center.

At the same time we nurture our own campus family, through our efforts to create a community of “responsible bystanders.” The Fitchburg Anti-Violence Education (FAVE) program has trained more than 2,300 students and 50 new trainers from the ranks of students, faculty and staff since its inception. The FAVE program is now an integral part of not just new student orientation, but campus life.



Our institutional evolution continues to manifest itself in our buildings and grounds. The new science center, to be substantially complete in May, is taking remarkable shape and will be a landmark feature of the campus.

Yet a curious thing occurred as we awaited completion of that site—an altogether different building significantly altered the campus vista.

The renovated Hammond Hall immediately established itself as a student hub without equal, an architectural gem and a welcoming front door to the university. Well into its fourth decade and long in need of a major renovation, the building’s rebirth exceeded all expectations, and our campus now has a stunning new entrance. In the pages that follow—and on the cover of this magazine—you will see these changes in striking detail.

It is a given that physical structures play a secondary role to the teaching and learning experience that is the foundation of our mission. But it is no less true that a solid student-centered learning environment extends beyond the classroom, and that in order to retain our overall level of excellence, we must renew and rebuild.

Innovation. Excellence. Collaboration. Service. Critical thinking. Transformation. These are the concepts to which we are committed, and by which we will chart our path forward.

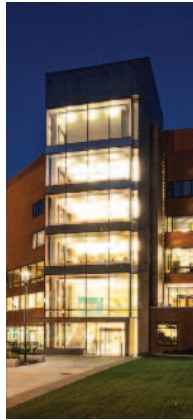

OUR NEW FRONT DOOR RENOVATION TRANSFORMS HAMMOND

IT PRACTICALLY GLOWS. The four-story glass tower that now greets visitors to Fitchburg State as they come up North Street from downtown is a profound architectural statement and a declaration of welcome bridging the community and the university.

Hammond Hall, the building that houses the campus center and the Amelia V. Gallucci-Cirio Library, is now transformed. The \$25 million project created a new front door for the university, opened up hundreds of square feet of gathering spaces for students, faculty, staff and visitors, and represents top-flight amenities that truly render it the campus' living room.

"This is a beautiful, small New England campus," President Antonucci said, describing the improved facilities at a ribbon-cutting ceremony this fall. "It's about time that public universities got the same consideration for facilities that private universities do."

"It's great the students are already taking full advantage of the building," said Carol T. Vittorioso, chairman of the university's Board of Trustees, who noted the contributions of her predecessors Peter Alcock and Gregg Lisciotti in making the renovated building possible.



The building, named for longtime Fitchburg State President James J. Hammond (1963-1975), was originally proposed in 1969 in response to a sharp rise in enrollment at the college. Hammond and the college's trustees sought to house the library and student union in one building to help secure state funding for the project. Plans for the facility were completed and put out for bid in 1972 and the building was opened for business in 1975.

A DREAM FULFILLED

For Peter Alcock, vice chairman of the Massachusetts State College Building Authority and former chairman of the Fitchburg State University Board of Trustees, traversing the renovated Hammond was the culmination of a years-long plan to transform the campus.

Alcock chaired his first meeting in the fall of 2001, a time of transition for Fitchburg State, where a renewed emphasis on the bricks and mortar of the campus was needed. "Everything had been done on a 'Let's patch it up every couple of years' basis," Alcock recalled. "We said, 'Let's fix it right, so it lasts 50 years.'"

That meant taking a hard look at the institutional budget, where Alcock said about 5 percent of spending



had been devoted to repairs. The trustees decided to increase it to 15 percent. And as they set about looking for a new president, he said, the board could see residence halls rebuilt, Mara Village completed, Elliot Field revamped and the Holmes Dining Commons upgraded.

It was a daunting slate of capital projects, Alcock said, but it was a necessity to move the institution forward. A long-term strategic plan was put into place, and the Fitchburg State University Foundation was tapped to play a critical role. “These foundations are established to support the institutional mission, and had been focused on scholarships,” Alcock said. “We suggested their help was needed with this effort.”

In the meantime, a national search had resulted in the hiring of President Antonucci, a two-time Fitchburg State alumnus and the former commissioner of education for the state of Massachusetts. In Antonucci, Alcock said, the trustees had found the leader who could move the campus transformation forward. With Antonucci on board, the trustees set their sights on North Street.

North Street had been a troublesome avenue for the university, with dilapidated housing and issues with crime. In response to this neighbor, Alcock said, the Hammond Campus Center had been designed and built to point the other way.

Twenty-nine parcels were identified and purchased with \$2.5 million of support from the university foundation. Many of the properties were demolished, and the decision was made to locate a new Campus Police headquarters in the middle of what had been a troubled neighborhood on Clinton Street.

“We bought all these buildings, tore them down, and put the police station right there, where it’s critical,”

Alcock said. “When we started cleaning up North Street, we had no idea if it was going to turn out. But it did.”

Improved sidewalks and streetlights were also key to creating an improved connection between the campus and the city.

With that years-long effort of property acquisition and demolition complete, it was time to look at the Hammond building with fresh eyes.

“What we wanted to accomplish in moving the institution forward was to embrace the city,” Alcock said. “We thought, let’s take this building and make it a gateway to the college: ‘Welcome to Fitchburg State University.’”

“We created a nice corridor and redeveloped North Street,” said Gregg Lisciotti, whose 10-year tenure on the board of trustees began at the same time Alcock first chaired the group.

A REAL PRIZE

The planners and architects set to work under the leadership of President Antonucci and Vice President for Finance and Administration Jay Bry. The project was led by the architectural firm DiMella Shaffer, with A.T. Leonard & Associates working with them on site and landscape design.

The master plan called for the existing grade along North Street to be excavated, creating a level exterior plaza that would accommodate an accessible entrance into the building, and allow for floor-to-ceiling glass. Exterior seating would be provided to extend the dining and study areas from inside the building out toward North Street.

Inside, a new atrium space was to be created by removing the existing staircase along with selected areas of floor slabs. The new atrium would provide a visual connection from the new entrance on the basement level up to the first-floor level and exterior quadrangle. A new stairway would be located near the new entrance, providing a clear, direct path from the basement floor to both ground and first floors. A new elevator was designed just beyond the stair to open access to all six levels.

In addition to the atrium, key components of the master plan included the creation of a central third-floor lobby near the new elevator entrance, around which most of the student support services would be located. By relocating existing program space on different floor levels, the library will be able to expand its first-floor computer area and provide acoustic separation from the student center lobby. The Bookstore was moved to the basement opposite food service, and the newly named

North Street Bistro—replacing the old Commuter Café—was to have a supplemental coffee serving space. The Underground Pub was reconfigured and expanded into the Falcon Hub.

The ground floor was redesigned as the home for student development, student government and student academic life, as well as student radio station WXPL. The first-floor student-event space was to offer improved function because lounge activity would be set up in the new atrium and tower, making function set-up

less disruptive. The second-floor mezzanine would serve largely as conference rooms, meeting rooms and a building-wide staff lounge.

All of this functionality carried with it the opportunity to create a welcoming gateway to the campus core. The resulting project and site improvements considered function, aesthetic, accessibility, master planning, and student opportunities.

Lisciotti, a developer by trade, gives the final project high marks. “By doing this, it certainly makes you feel like you’ve arrived on campus. We needed something with some pizzazz,” he said. “It’s a front door, it really is. And inside, it’s just amazing. It ties in so nicely with everything else that’s been happening to the campus.”

Lisciotti credits the board and administration for the realization of the transformative project.

“We had a master plan, and a lot of folks worked hard to make it happen,” Lisciotti said. “It’s nice to see it go from a piece of paper to completion.”

The investments are worth making in a competitive marketplace, Lisciotti said, where campus amenities are prized by students and families.

AN EXEMPLARY GATHERING SPACE



When Fitchburg Mayor Lisa A. Wong spoke at the ribbon-cutting ceremony about the renovated building, she pointed out that the new entryway to Hammond Hall was indicative of the strong relationship between the city and the campus.

After the renovations, Wong said, “this is a whole different approach to the city.”





Matthew Costello, a senior and president of the Student Government Association, also works in Hammond as a building manager. “I have witnessed the utilization and appreciation by students increase tenfold,” he said. “With the addition of several new student lounge spaces, new and central student organization offices, a completely distinctive set of restaurants in the North Street Bistro, and more, the renovation of this building has yielded spectacular results.

“Looking back in my service on student government, I can recall a construction meeting where myself and other members of SGA advocated for students’ needs

in this new building,” Costello said. “That meeting left me excited and optimistic. However, it was not until the pictures and room layouts came to life this fall when I noticed the full potential of this campus center. I can confidently say that the final result of this process has surpassed any of my expectations.”

Mary Panico, a senior communications major, manages the building’s Information Desk. From her sunlit station at the glass entrance of the building, Panico has seen the renovations translate into greater traffic at Hammond.

“More students are spending their time here as a place to relax, socialize, eat and study,” Panico said.

“The new Falcon Hub serves as an open environment for students to use as a meeting space among friends as well as finish up some work before a class. There isn’t a single point in the day where the building isn’t being occupied.”

Panico also gets a front-row seat to the reaction that visitors—including alumni—have to the transformed Hammond.

“Every reaction is virtually the same: people are surprised and more so very satisfied with the results,” she said. “I’ve talked to alumni from years ago who cannot believe their eyes when they walk in. It really does look beautiful.”

And the building is more than just a pretty space.

“I believe the newly renovated campus center will continue to serve as the living room of the campus,” Panico said. “It truly is an excellent environment for people to gather for whatever purpose they need to. There are approximately 150 more events that are held in the campus center this year. Clubs, organizations and individuals definitely take advantage of the new conference rooms, meeting spaces and lounge areas.”

“All over campus I hear students, faculty, staff, and even guests of our institution look at the changes that are being made, and they are very impressed,” said Nathan

Gregoire, the student representative to the board of trustees. “Every successful institution needs a busy campus center filled with students and we certainly have that here. I look forward to seeing how the renovation changes the relationship between the city of Fitchburg and the university, and it sure seems to be the beginning of a very strong and lasting partnership to educate new students in a safe and secure environment.”

PROGRESS PERSONIFIED

For Peter Alcock, it’s a dream come true. “What I’m absolutely thrilled about is seeing it all coming together,” he said. “You really need to start with a plan, and we did that 10 years ago. It takes time. It was a little bit of a turnaround situation, and everyone kicked in. Everyone in this community kicked in, and the Foundation’s piece was more important than perhaps they’ve been given credit for.”

“The architects and the administration did a great job,” Alcock continued. “Right now, the university is really primed. Anybody who comes on campus is stunned. It’s really thrilling.”

Antonucci said creating more quality gathering places for students was a key component of the plan.

“It’s all about the students,” he said, stressing that quality facilities are important to the campus, even though it is the work done by faculty in the classrooms that make the university shine. The university can back up its boasts about academic quality with data, he said, and the improvements to the campus are another physical manifestation of its progress. “We’re on the move.”

COUNTLESS LIVES TOUCHED

Nursing Department's success
spans the globe

This fall the university celebrated the 50th anniversary of its Department of Nursing, bringing back more than 150 graduates of the program for a look back at its rich history and a glimpse into its bright future.

The day started off in the Kent Recital Hall with an introduction from President Antonucci, who described the department as one of the university's most stellar programs.

"We're proud of the accomplishments you've made," he said, praising the graduates for their hard work and dedication to the craft.

HISTORY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF NURSING

■ The preparation of highly skilled nurses is one of Fitchburg State's proudest legacies. Even before Fitchburg State formally established its Department of Nursing in 1962, the university collaborated with the Burbank Hospital School to become the first educational institution in Massachusetts to offer nursing students a baccalaureate degree.

■ Among the university's most rigorous programs, the Department of Nursing graduates students capable of combining the latest technological innovations with holistic techniques to provide high quality care that meets the diverse needs of changing populations and environments.



■ Since its inception, the Department of Nursing has graduated more than 3,500 nurses who have practiced around the world.

“It’s all about doing the job well and doing it right, being the best trained nurse you can possibly be,” he said. “It’s what you do when you leave this university in your field of study.”

While Antonucci heaped praise onto the program and its graduates, it was clear that the feeling of appreciation was mutual.

“You have literally transformed this university and community,” said keynote speaker Patrice Nicholas, addressing the president.

Nicholas received her bachelor of science in nursing from Fitchburg State in 1977 and currently serves as director of Global Health and Academic Partnerships at Brigham and Women’s Hospital. Since graduating from Fitchburg, Nicholas’ nursing career has taken her to places including South Africa, where she served as a Fulbright Senior Scholar of University of KwaZulu-Natal. While completing a postdoctoral fellowship at Harvard University School of

Public Health, she focused her research on HIV/AIDS and chronic illness.

Nicholas’ work in Africa and with HIV was a major part of her presentation at the reunion, shedding facts and insight on the disease and how it affects people globally.

She revealed that HIV is the “causal link between health and economic welfare more than any other disease,” adding it takes a profound humanitarian toll.

In addition to her work with HIV, Nicholas also discussed some other global nursing challenges, such as low birth rates in industrial countries, along with growth rates, chronic illness, care of the aging population, and emerging infectious diseases in developing countries.

Nicholas said nursing extends far beyond the doctor’s office.

“Nursing has a social responsibility to address issues affecting the health of the world’s people,” she said. “They apply critical thinking skills, excellent clinical knowledge, and technology-based skills in nearly all roles.”

This responsibility is reflected in Fitchburg State’s goals for the nursing department, which Nicholas said “explicitly describes the social responsibility of nursing.”

It is this sense of gratification for the department that was a running theme throughout the day.

Nicholas said that her nursing journey “makes me feel like the luckiest girl in the world.” But attending Fitchburg State is what started her on this path, which she describes as one of the “most fortunate events” in her life.

“This celebration has personal and professional meaning to all of us,” Nicholas told her friends and former classmates. “My closest colleagues and friends are Fitchburg State graduates.”

DEPARTMENT OF NURSING TIMELINE

1943

A combined education program with Burbank Hospital School is established, making Fitchburg State the first educational institution in Massachusetts to offer a baccalaureate degree for nursing students.

1954

Fitchburg State establishes its own distinct nursing program, and receives accreditation from the National League for Nursing. The combined program with Burbank Hospital continues.

1963

The Fitchburg State Department of Nursing is established.



1964

The combined program ends. Burbank Hospital School continues in existence until its closure in 1982.

Connections in Nursing

The story of the nursing department's evolution was shared during a panel discussion which featured a graduate from each decade of its existence.

From 1943-1964, Fitchburg State had a combined program with the Burbank Hospital School. Sally Bauman '53 said

Burbank's nursing school was renowned and that her Bachelor of Science from what was then known as Fitchburg State Teacher's College, allowed her to follow any avenue that required a degree.

Going back to the '60s, when 1962 graduate Ann Walsh attended, times were different both on the campus and in the world. Walsh summarized this era by saying "it was the best of times, it was the worst of times," citing Woodstock, the Beatles, and the Vietnam War as some of the major influences of her time.

She explained that during the first two years, students took a rigorous number of courses at Fitchburg State such as art, psychology, and world history, while the summers were

spent taking nursing classes at Burbank. The first semester cost 50 dollars and the second cost 100 dollars.

Students had to be in their dormitories by 10 p.m. on weekdays, and freshmen were not allowed to sit on the front steps of Thompson Hall between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4 p.m. Though many aspects of campus life have changed since then, Walsh believes her alma mater's focus remains squarely on education.

Denise Garlick '84 carried her focus on health care into the political arena, running for state representative in 2011. At the reunion, Garlick noted the issues that were important to student nurses carried over into the corridors of Beacon Hill.

And the voters agreed, sending Garlick to the Statehouse last year.

"Citizens believe that there are nurses in this commonwealth that truly care about them," Garlick said. "People trust nurses."



Linda McKay, chair of the Nursing Department, shared in its 50th anniversary celebration.

Renee Crizer '06 echoed that notion, describing the current state of nursing education at Fitchburg State.

"My teachers were the life of the college," Crizer said, citing clinical lab as her favorite part of the program. "In my experience here, I made so many friendships with the students."

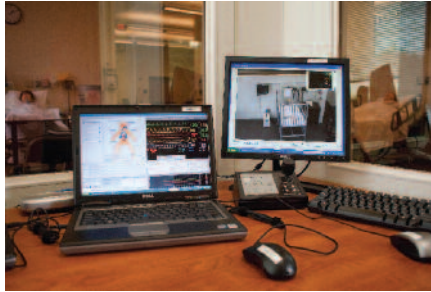

Passion for Nursing

Following the panel discussion, the visiting alumni toured the new, state-of-the-art lab facilities on the third floor of Thompson Hall. The updated labs include life-like mannequins that breathe, talk, and run a pulse, as well as exam tables, stethoscopes, otoscopes, blood pressure readers, hospital beds and lift machines.

The visitors shared their impressions of the new amenities while enjoying a glimpse into their department's history. Outside of the simulated hospital room is a glass case

filled with nursing mementos, such as a student nurse uniform and cap from 1963 and a community equipment bag, from years past and framed pictures of nursing classes over various decades.

At the end of the day, it was clear that there was a strong sense of community and appreciation toward both the university and nursing department. Nicholas was also very pleased with the how the reunion went, calling it a “resounding success.” She also expressed that her experience at Fitchburg State motivated her to pursue a career in nursing. “Fitchburg State has inspired my career. From the president to the faculty, the commitment to students is palpable.”

During her final culminating course in advanced medical and surgical nursing, Nicholas worked in the intensive care unit at St. Vincent Hospital, an experience that had a great impact on her career.

“My clinical instructor instilled confidence in me in a situation where patients were in intense acuity,” she said, describing a patient in a state of severe illness. “Her style of teaching translated into my style of teaching.”

No matter where her career has taken her, Nicholas’ passion for nursing has always been constant. “Nursing is the best career choice,” Nicholas said. “There’s lots of flexibility. You couldn’t possibly get bored working as a nurse.”

Campus News Roundup

“Accredit” to our quality

The New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) has renewed Fitchburg State’s accreditation through 2022, describing a forward-looking institution, committed to excellence and investing in its facilities and community under the leadership of President Antonucci and a committed board of trustees.

In a letter informing the university of its decision, NEASC Chair Richard L. Pattenaude commended Fitchburg State for a “participatory evaluation process that resulted in a candid, well-written self-study. We note with approval that widespread discussions among the campus community became the basis for the university’s mission statement, vision statement, core values, and the goals and objectives” of the university’s strategic plan.

“We are gratified to learn that the leadership of the president and his team has led to a renewed pride in and excitement about the institution and that a committed and qualified board of trustees and alumni firmly and enthusiastically support the university,” Pattenaude continued. “We share the judgment of the team that (Fitchburg State) faculty and staff are devoted to students’

needs and success and committed to the vision of the institution as a university.”

Off-campus and distance education programs are also overseen effectively, according to NEASC, and the group congratulated the university on its capital projects, including the \$57 million science center now under construction.

“With an experienced leadership team, dedicated faculty and staff, and a supportive Board of Trustees, the university is positioned for future success,” Pattenaude wrote.

“The NEASC accreditation review was a thorough and demanding process, in which we incorporated all campus constituencies to take a long, hard look at ourselves, chronicling our strengths as well as areas for improvement,” President Antonucci said. “I am proud that NEASC has awarded us their longest term of accreditation. I also appreciate their recognition of all that we do well, even as the report will guide us as we look to create an even stronger institution.”

The university will submit a five-year interim report in 2017 and NEASC has scheduled Fitchburg State’s next comprehensive evaluation for spring 2022.

The university underwent a comprehensive evaluation visit in March by a team

representing NEASC’s Commission on Institutions of Higher Education. The site visit followed a year and a half of exhaustive self-study by university faculty, administrators, staff and students. The visiting team gathered evidence that the self-study was thorough and accurate.

The Commission on Institutions of Higher Education is one of seven accrediting commissions in the United States that provide institutional accreditation on a regional basis. Accreditation is voluntary and applies to the institution as a whole. The Commission, which is recognized by the U.S. Department of Education, accredits approximately 240 institutions in the six-state New England region.

Fitchburg State University has been accredited by the Commission since 1953 and was last reviewed in 2002. Its accreditation by the New England Association encompasses the entire institution.

Beats us

Following the screening, Antonelli spoke with students and faculty about his work and his path to accomplished filmmaker.

“There’s a lot of strength in following the conviction of what you’re trying to do,” he said, recalling instances where his passion for a subject translated into favors that helped him realize his film projects.

It was a lesson he said was forged during his free speech experience at Fitchburg State, when he was editor of the student newspaper,

The Cycle. The newspaper had sought to publish a piece by controversial figure Eldridge Cleaver but their efforts were stymied by then-President James Hammond. When Hammond installed an advisory panel that would have the right to review any *Cycle* content before publication, the students balked. The case went to federal court and Antonelli and his peers were victorious.

Many of the participants in that case returned to campus a year ago to discuss their experiences for the university's observation of Constitution Day. One of Antonelli's fellow plaintiffs was Dave Celuzza, now the owner of Slattery's Restaurant, who also attended the screening.

No to the silo

Recently, Fitchburg State, Mount Wachusett Community College and Quinsigamond Community College signed articulation agreements that will allow for seamless training and educational opportunities for members of the state's advanced manufacturing workforce.

Officials from the Patrick-Murray Administration, U.S. Rep. James McGovern, state legislators and officials from Massachusetts Manufacturing Extension Partnership joined representatives from the institutions of higher education to announce the agreements, which were signed during a ceremony at Presidents' Hall in the Mazzaferro Center.

"We believe in collaboration," President Antonucci told the assembled crowd, describing the institutions of public higher education in Central Massachusetts, including Fitchburg State, Mount Wachusett, Quinsigamond and Worcester State University. "Workforce development is a key component of the four institutions of higher education. We know what the community needs because we are the community."

Quinsigamond President Gail Carberry said the institutions of public higher education already enjoy strong relationships, sharing best practices and working toward common goals.

"It is about partnerships," Carberry said. "It is about our ability to get things done."

McGovern said manufacturing is key to the state's future, and said education will be an important factor in its success. The articulation agreements are indicators of strategic partnerships between the private and public sectors.

"Part of the natural resources of Massachusetts, I've always felt, are our colleges and universities," McGovern said. "Collaboration is very, very important. The private sector needs the assistance of the public sector."

"Advanced manufacturing remains a strong and dynamic sector that offers increased opportunity for workers to obtain

and retain good, benefited jobs while contributing to the future of their employers and greater economic strength for the commonwealth," said Secretary of Labor and Workforce Development Joanne F. Goldstein.

"This collaboration creates career pathways that fulfill employers' needs while improving our workforce's options. It is a reflection not only of successful public-private partnerships, but also an outstanding example of the Patrick-Murray administration's commitment to collaboration between state governmental entities in workforce development, education and economic development, which leads to a brighter economic future for all."

Secretary of Education Paul Reville described the importance of preparing students for the high-tech jobs that need to be filled, and how public-private partnerships will be key to that effort.

"We can't do this work alone," he said. "What we're talking about today is reaching beyond the silo of education. We will only succeed in educating our children to the highest standard if we work together."

Assistant Secretary for Innovation Policy Eric Nakajima said the agreements indicate an opportunity for the region to grow advanced manufacturing as an economic sector. "This is the moment for us to focus on manufacturing," Nakajima said. "There's lots of evidence to show we're on the right track."





New trustees on board

The university welcomed two new members to its Board of Trustees this fall—**Donald R. Irving** (pictured above) and **Michael A. Mahan** (pictured at right).

Donald Irving is founder and president of Data Guide Cable Corp. in Gardner. He has run the business, a specialty cable manufacturer with 60 full-time employees, since 1984. Prior to starting Data Guide, he was an engineering manager with Mohawk/Conductron Corp. in Leominster and also worked as an electronics instructor and industrial technology instructor at schools in Ashburnham and Northborough.

Irving is also president of Nichols Square LLC, a real estate development firm, and in 1993 he was honored by former President George H.W. Bush as the Massachusetts Business Person of the year. He is an avid horologist, building, restoring and collecting

clocks (with a specialty in 18th-century brass English clocks). He also holds a patent for a fiber optic connector.

Irving served on the board of trustees for the Applewild School in Fitchburg for 10 years and was also a member of the Ashburnham-Westminster Regional School Committee, where he served as chairman. He is the treasurer of the board at Cushing Academy in Ashburnham, where he has been a member for 17 years including 12 as its vice president.

Irving is a two-time alumnus of Fitchburg State, earning a bachelor's degree in industrial science and a master's degree in industrial technology from the institution. He and his wife, Karen Lindroth (herself a Fitchburg State alumna) live in Westminster.



Michael Mahan is an operations manager with Staples Inc. and an accomplished business

and technology consultant. His duties at Staples include responsibility, within the information technology organization, for a multimillion-dollar program to streamline operations and profitability for Staples.com.

Prior to accepting that post, Mahan worked as a principal of real estate and operations for CA Technologies in Framingham, where he was responsible for the real estate and mergers and acquisitions needs of the research and development organization. He also served as a department manager for PCI/Wolters Kluwer Financial Services in Boston and a management and technology consultant for Accenture and PricewaterhouseCoopers.

Mahan earned a bachelor of science in industrial engineering from Worcester Polytechnic Institute in 2001 and a master of business administration from Boston College's Carroll School of Management in 2008.

His civic involvement includes serving on the board of directors of the Thayer Symphony Orchestra, having previously served as its president, and as a member of the city of Leominster's water and sewer commission. He has already lent his talents to Fitchburg State as a member of the board of directors for the Fitchburg State University Foundation, Inc., where he was a member of its finance committee.

Mahan, his wife Heather, and their daughter live in Leominster.

University lauded for anti-violence initiatives

President Antonucci was recognized this fall with the Great Guys Award by the YWCA Central Massachusetts in recognition of the campus-wide Fitchburg Anti-Violence Education (FAVE) program.

The honor was presented during the Daybreak Breakfast that kicked off Domestic Violence Awareness Month.

The YWCA Central Massachusetts created The Great Guy Award in 2004 to recognize the outstanding contributions of men in the central Massachusetts community who have been inspired to learn and better understand the issue of domestic violence, and who have demonstrated their commitment to end violence against women and children.

Antonucci was recognized because of his support for FAVE, launched in 2011 to prevent interpersonal and relationship violence, sexual assault and to support those affected by such violence.

"This award recognizes Fitchburg State's commitment to building a safer, healthier community, on campus and beyond," Antonucci said. "I'm proud of the work we have done at the university and our commitment to addressing these issues."

FAVE is directed by Fitchburg State Professor Jannette McMenemy and its assistant director is Erin Travia M.A., LMHC (licensed mental health counselor) of

Fitchburg State's Counseling Services. FAVE collaborates with the YWCA of Central Massachusetts/Battered Women's Resources to meet training needs and to link survivors with community-based resources.

A key component of FAVE is mandatory educational programming for incoming first-year and transfer students about issues of interpersonal and relationship violence and sexual assault. More than 2,200 students have been trained since the program's inception in 2011.

The FAVE project is supported by a grant awarded to Fitchburg State University by the U.S. Department of Justice Office on Violence Against Women, through the Grants to Reduce Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, and Stalking on Campus Program.

The keynote speaker for the event was actress Lisa Regina, herself a survivor of domestic abuse and the founder of *A Write To Heal*, a non-profit organization that utilizes the power of words and voices through writing, performance, and filmmaking exercises.

Culture Culture Zone

The university celebrated its role as a regional arts and culture hub with a season full of performances and exhibitions that spotlighted local and international talent.

Ireland's Gare St. Lazare Players presented an unforgettable one-man adaptation of Herman Melville's *Moby Dick*. Actor Conor Lovett delivered a mesmerizing performance



to a packed house at Percival Auditorium, including hundreds of students from more than 10 academic classes. Lovett's visit was akin to a mini-residency, as he visited classrooms to talk about Melville's landmark novel, and led a theater workshop at Weston Auditorium where he discussed his craft with students. The performance was part of the CenterStage at Fitchburg State arts and culture series.

Later in the fall, Fitchburg State theater students presented a successful run of Tracy Letts' Pulitzer Prize-winning drama *August: Osage County* at the George R. and Alice Wallace Theater for Performing Arts at the McKay Complex. A talented cast, led by Dean of Education Dr. Pamela Hill, took audiences on a tumultuous journey into the lives of a



dysfunctional American family. Many of the actors from *August: Osage County* traveled during the summer to Scotland to compete in the Edinburgh Festival Fringe where their adaptation of William Shakespeare's *Romeo and Juliet* earned strong reviews.

In December, 80 members of the Greater Gardner Community Choir joined the renowned Harlem Gospel Choir on the stage at Weston Auditorium for another CenterStage main event.



The visual arts were also spotlighted, with exhibitions in the Sanders Administration Building art gallery by artists Peter Zierlein and Scott Listfield. And on the media wall in Conlon Hall, communications media faculty members Peter Laytin and Jeff Warmouth had their own works on display.

"This has been an exciting year for us with multiple points of access into the arts, from acting workshops to art gallery talks and pre-performance conversations with scholars," Director of Cultural Affairs



Mary Chapin Durling said. "The arts are so much more than a static performance. Removing artificial barriers like gallery walls, and creating public art space and media wall installations, engage the campus community in new and vital ways."

University spotlights citizenship

The university observed the 225th anniversary of the signing of the U.S. Constitution in the fall with a panel discussion on immigration and the rights and responsibilities of citizenship.

Constitution Day is observed Sept. 17, in recognition of the document's signing on that date in 1787.

U.S. District Judge Timothy S. Hillman (pictured, above right), a Fitchburg resident who earlier in the fall presided over a hearing at Weston Auditorium where 299 applicants took the oath of citizenship, described the vitality and genius of the government-defining document.



“We have the oldest and shortest constitution in the world,” Judge Hillman said, describing how its interpretations have value even in a landscape ever changed by technology. Electronic surveillance, for example, was nothing the founders could have imagined, yet the constitution’s protections against unlawful search and seizure apply and are being grappled with by the Supreme Court. “It just shows you how well the 225-year-old document has aged.”

Ammad Sheikh, director of the university’s Expanding Horizons program, described his own journey to citizenship. A native of Pakistan, Sheikh emigrated to the U.S. in 1995 as a teenager. He was recruited into the Navy and applied for citizenship in 1999.

Sheikh said he was struck by the value his adopted country placed on free speech, recalling a Ku Klux Klan protest he saw on television where members of the organization were being protected by African-American police officers. He also took the opportunity to remind those in the audience that many members of the

armed forces aren’t U.S. citizens, though their service does open a path to citizenship.

“There are thousands of Americans who can say, ‘Only my story is possible in the U.S.’,” Sheikh said. “We should take pride in who we are as Americans, and what that means.”

More context on the difficulties facing immigrants was offered by Professor Teresa Fava Thomas, who described the trials that faced Italian immigrants in the early 20th century. Factions of “immigration restrictionists” fought “assimilationists” as the influx unfolded. Massachusetts in general, and the city of Fitchburg in particular, had a high percentage of foreign-born residents even a century ago.

The Constitution Day observances ended with Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs Paul Weizer, assisted by Reference and Special Collections Librarian Kate Wells, administering a pop quiz of the audience, who fielded questions from the citizenship test.

OUR OLYMPIANS University celebrates alumni athletic stand-outs

During Family Weekend this fall, Fitchburg State paid tribute to its accomplished alumni at ceremonies saluting standout scholar-athletes from its past and graduates who have gone on to make an impact in their communities.

Amenemhet Ashenafi (formerly known as D’Andra Freeman), a member of the class of 2002, is among the most prolific football players in Fitchburg State University history. At the conclusion of his collegiate career Ashenafi held nearly all of Fitchburg State’s rushing records in addition to some league records. A native of Waterbury, Conn., Ashenafi now lives in Oxon Hills, Md. where he is the father of two young sons—whose youth football team he coaches—and works in the Washington, D.C., public schools.

Bruce Grealey of West Bradenton, Fla., a member of the class of 1957, was in a class by himself throughout his four-year student athletic career at Fitchburg State. A three-sport athlete, Grealey excelled in basketball, soccer and baseball, serving as captain of the basketball and soccer teams for all four of his years with each squad. In basketball, Grealey aver-

aged nearly 25 points per game, ranking fifth in scoring among small New England colleges. He played semiprofessional basketball after graduation and later coached the men’s team at Framingham State in addition to his 40 years as a Framingham public school teacher.

Armen Harootian of Reading is a member of the class of 1952. Born and raised in Worcester, Harootian is known as much for his athletic abilities as for his charisma and leadership skills. At Fitchburg State he was instrumental in the formal recognition of outdoor track, indoor track, and cross country as varsity sports. He was selected as captain for each sport’s inaugural season, retaining these titles throughout his collegiate career. In addition, he played for the undefeated soccer team that twice won the New England Athletic Conference championship and the National Intercollegiate Athletics Final Four Tournament.

Harootian’s abilities extended beyond the field, and he was elected class president four times and king of the Carnival Ball in 1963, alongside queen—and future wife—Polly Pappas. He continues to work full-time in real estate development and his children joke that he has more energy than his five grandchildren.

Amy (Kosiewski) Richard of Ashby is a member of the class of 1994. One of the most talented

players in the history of Fitchburg State field hockey, she was renowned for her speed, stick-work, passing and powerful shots on goal. At the conclusion of her collegiate career, Richard held the field hockey record for single season assists (14) and points (60) and all-time career goals (36), assists (33) and points (105), a feat accomplished in just three years. She was the Fitchburg State Field Hockey Most Valuable Player in the 1992 and 1993 seasons, the MASCAC Field Hockey Player of the Year in 1993 and the Fitchburg State Athlete of the Year in 1994. Now a mother of three, Richard coaches field hockey in Townsend.

The Alumni Association recognized its own distinguished members this fall.

Ronald P. Colbert '76, '80 of Wilmington was recognized for his service as president of the Alumni Association. Colbert has been an active licensed teacher and administrator in Massachusetts for almost four decades. Colbert graduated in 1976 from Fitchburg State with a bachelor's degree in elementary education, and soon added his Master of Education degree with concentrations as a reading specialist and school principal. He went on to earn a doctorate in curriculum and instruction from Boston University, specializing in early childhood education. Colbert began his distinguished career as a preschool teacher, elementary school teacher, and elementary school principal. For the last 23

years at Fitchburg State he has taught both undergraduate and graduate students and pursued many research interests, particularly in curriculum development.

Christopher M. McKillop '08 of Brighton was given the Booster Award. McKillop studied communications media and video production at Fitchburg State, where he found a special talent for planning large-scale projects. McKillop produced a successful internship public service announcement for the department that led him to his first job. He is now managing a team of eight production managers who produce streaming media products in the field of business-to-business IT Media for Tech Target in Newton. He is also the co-founder of the annual Fitchburg State University Alumni Pub Tour in Boston, the city he now calls home.

Timothy P. Graham '11 of Arlington was also given the Booster Award. Studying exercise and sports science, Graham not only excelled in the classroom but also on the basketball and football teams. His leadership and dedication made him the captain of the basketball team and the school representative on the Student Athlete Advisory Committee. His knowledge of fitness and sports inspired Graham to become a physical education teacher, now working in the Boston public schools where he enjoys the challenge of motivating and educating students in sports and living a healthy lifestyle. Robert J. "Biff" Quinn '81 of Roslindale was presented the Alumni Service Award. Quinn was an active member of the Pi Sigma Upsilon chapter of the Fenwick Society, a local campus fraternity which twice recognized him as its Brother of the Year award. Quinn served as a class representative on the Student Government Association his junior and senior years. Quinn joined the Watertown Fire Department in 1987 and is currently a deputy fire chief.

He has received numerous department commendations, including the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Group Rescue Award for saving a human life. He is an Eagle Scout and has been a longtime adult leader for the Boston Minute-man Council of the Boy Scouts of America. Quinn continues his service as a passionate member of the Fenwick Society, serving as a liaison between the society and the Fitchburg State University Alumni Association. Because of his efforts, countless Fenwick and inter-fraternal reunions have been attended by hundreds of Fitchburg State alumni. Quinn resides in Roslindale with his wife, Eileen, and his three children, Rebecca, Robert Jr. and Bridget.

Edward A. King '94 of Braintree was given the Alumni Leadership Award. The Leominster High School graduate enlisted in the United States Marine Corps, and it was during his service that he attended Fitchburg State while also working full-time as a machine operator at a printing press in Leominster. After returning from active duty service during Operation Desert Shield/Storm, he graduated summa cum laude with a major in business management from Fitchburg State in 1994. Joseph P. Indresano '60 of Oviedo, Fla., was given the Alumni Achievement Award. Upon the recommendation of a Winthrop High School industrial arts teacher, Indresano attended Fitchburg State after four years of service with the U.S. Coast Guard. Indresano earned his degree in 1960, when President James J. Hammond introduced a sound methodology of teaching in the field of industrial arts. He took those lessons to his career teaching in the Department of Defense (DoD) schools. In his position with the DoD schools, he taught children of military parents on U.S. military bases in France, Japan and Germany, and was promoted to industrial arts coordinator for the system in 1967. From 1973 to 1979, he was chief of career development for all DoD schools. Law and Order

Two teams will represent Fitchburg State University at the American Collegiate Moot Court Association's annual tournament in the coming weeks as a result of their performance at the qualifying tournament held on campus.

The Fitchburg State teams—Matthew Costello and Haley Schilling, and Angela Szymcick and Robert Sivazlian—will represent Fitchburg State at Regent University Law School in Virginia Beach.

The regional tournament, which brought 48 teams from 15 colleges and universities to Fitchburg State, was won by Michelle Freeman and Jacob Gomez of the California State University at Fullerton, who defeated Gianni Cramer and William Manning of Bentley University in the final round.

The tournament in January will mark Costello's fourth national event. It is rare for

freshmen to compete in the tournament but Costello, also president of the Student Government Association, has competed in all four years at Fitchburg State and earned national distinction in each of them.

Szymcick will be making her second trip to the national tournament. Schilling—daughter of Fitchburg State faculty members—and Sivazlian will be making their first appearance there in January.

Fitchburg State's Moot Court team has a history of strong showings at the regional event, advancing to the national moot court competition 12 consecutive times. The university has consistently advanced to the second day of national competition since 2000 and remains the only school in the nation to make the break in every national tournament.

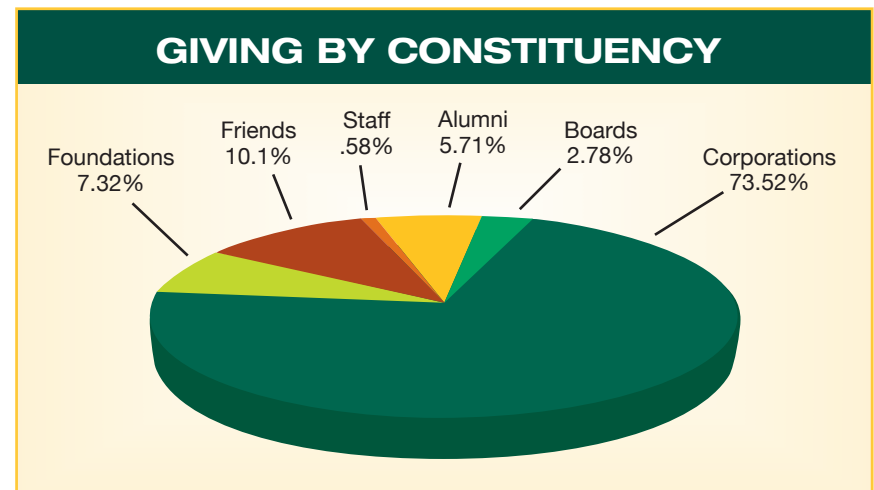

Pay It Forward with Pride

When Don and Karen Irving recently approached the university about establishing a new scholarship program, they added a unique twist that will impact generations of Fitchburg State students. This scholarship program requests recipients to “Pay It Forward” when they have the ability.

To “pay it forward” is to have the beneficiary of a good deed repay it to someone else, instead of returning the kindness to the original benefactor.

“Our hope when creating this scholarship was that each recipient would eventually contribute back to the university during their lifetime,” said Don. “There is no legal obligation to pay back the funds, but rather a conscientious commitment to contribute back to the program when possible. This will undoubtedly help foster a more positive philanthropic culture on campus, and ultimately lead to greater scholarship support.”

The Pay It Forward Scholarship Program is also a challenge to other alumni to contribute back to their alma mater.

“We hope other alumni will join us in giving back to Fitchburg State,” said Karen. “As recipients of these scholarships graduate and find their place in life, we believe the opportunity they received will help them understand the importance of reciprocating and helping other students.”

The Donald R. '72, '79 and Karen A. Irving '90 Pay It Forward Scholarship Program will provide a minimum of four \$5,000 scholarships annually. The first four recipients will be chosen in April. As a renewing scholarship, each student has the potential to receive this award up to four years.

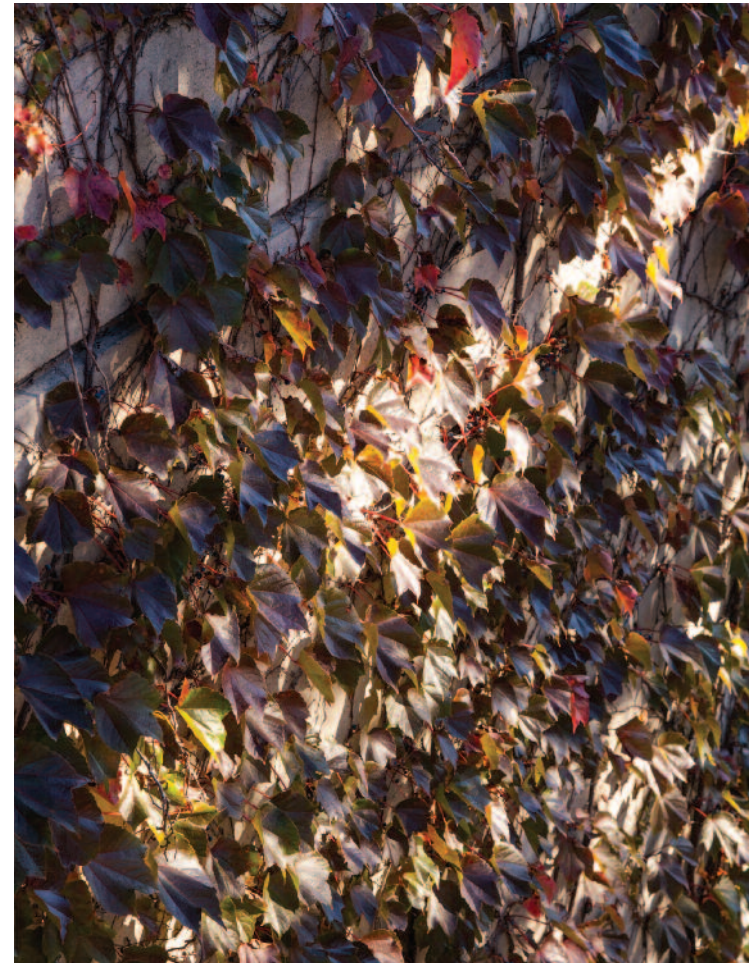
