We would like to prohibit students from receiving credit for both of the two Ethics courses we offer, and to change the catalogue description of CJ 7300 by adding, "Note: Credit may not be given for both CJ 7300, Professional Responsibility and

Community Relations for Law Enforcement; and CJ 8580, Ethical Issues in Criminal Justice," to the end of the description.

Rationale and expected outcomes of course change

The CJ graduate program, expanding its focus beyond law enforcement, has recently revived its more general Ethics course, CJ 8580. CJ 8580 will be required course for future students, pursuant to revisions that have been enacted this year by the Graduate Council. The Ethics course that had been required, CJ 7300, concerns only law enforcement, which is a component but not the whole of the criminal justice system. The content of the two courses overlaps a great deal, however, so we believe that it would be inappropriate for a student to receive credit for both.

Course Syllabus
